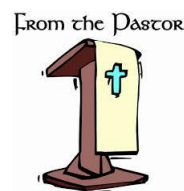

 We begin the holiest of weeks within the Church year this week. Palm Sunday celebrates Jesus' royal entry into Jerusalem. The many symbols of royalty within this event continue through other events of this week. Between this royal theme and the theme of the destruction/renewal of the

Temple culminate Jesus' ministry on this earth. Jesus has been trying to show through his teaching and miracles not only his divinity but his royalty in the line King David and how all worship is now gathered to himself.
